

Educational and Methodological Work

At the department, the subject "Obstetrics and Gynecology in Family Medicine" is taught in the following areas: 4th year "General Medicine"

The subject "Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatric Gynecology" is taught in the following areas: 4-5-6 courses "Pediatrics," "General Medicine."

The subject "Obstetrics and Gynecology" is taught in the following areas: 4th year "Stomatology," "Medical and Preventive Care," "Medical Biology," 3rd year "Higher Nursing."

The subject "Reproductive Health" is taught in the following direction: 3rd year "Folk Medicine."

The subject of "Neonatology" is taught in the following areas: 4-5 courses "Pediatrics," "General Medicine."

The department has 2 master's degree residents and 7 clinical residents of the 1st-2nd year of study.



In order to improve the quality of education of students, the educational process is carried out on the basis of a program approved by the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation of the Republic of Uzbekistan. Lectures (in Karakalpak, Uzbek, and Russian) and test collections for each lecture have been prepared for the disciplines "Obstetrics and Gynecology in Family Medicine," "Obstetrics and Gynecology," "Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatric Gynecology," "Reproductive Health," and "Neonatology."

Training is conducted according to the following approved documents for the course:

- State standard;

During training, the following are available:

There is a telecommunication system, video films, presentations, multimedia programs, lectures, and practical exercises on the topic are demonstrated using video projectors connected to a computer.

The department is located at the base and all conditions have been created for students to examine pregnant women bimanually and participate in surgeries.

Curators provide students with the opportunity to participate in natural childbirth, learn to properly separate and isolate the placenta, allowing them to observe on their own. This practical approach helps students better understand and memorize concepts than when learning only in theory.
